- 2) A meeting of the City Council of Fayetteville will be held at the City Hall of Fayetteville at 8:00 P. M. on the 25th day of JUNE, 1962, on the proposed improvements shall be made in writing, signed in person or by Attorney, and filed with the Clerk of the City of Fayetteville at or before such time, and any such objections not so made will be waived.
- 3) This RESOLUTION and ORDER shall be published once in the FAYETTEVILLE OBSERVER, a newspaper published in the City of Fayetteville, ten (10) days before the time fixed for said meeting.

A petition was then presented for the paving of that section of Maiden Lane which lies between Burgess Street and Ray Avenue. The petition was signed by 100% of the property owners. Since the City owns property which abutts Maiden Lane (Central School Property) the Council, upon motion by Councilman Rhodes, seconded by Councilman Maness voted unanimously to authorize Mayor Butler to sign the petition for the City by adoption of the following resolution:

PRELIMINARY RESOLUTION
REQUIRING THE PAVING,

PURSUANT TO PETITION,

MAIDEN LANE

After careful study and consideration of the matter and of all pertinent facts and circumstances, including engineering and planning studies and advice, and in the exercise of its best legislative judgment, The City Council of Fayetteville, North Carolina, finds as fact that:

1) A petition, pursuant to North Carolina General Statute 160-82, et seq, has been filed with The City Council of Fayetteville, North Carolina, requesting the paving and other below described improvement of MAIDEN LANE, and said petition is in due and sufficient form, containing a general description of the paving and other improvement proposed for said Street, and requesting that such paving and other improvement be made in conformity with the applicable provisions of law, and that the proportion of the cost of such paving and other improvement below specified be specially assessed against the property abutting on said Street, and said petition has been signed by at least a majority in number of the owners, who own at least a majority of all lineal feet of frontage, of the lands abutting on said Street.

and

2) The public interest, safety, convenience and general welfare requires the paying and other below described improvement of MAIDEN LANE;

and

3) The property abutting on said street to be so paved and improved will be benefited by such pavement and improvement to the extent of the part of the cost thereof to be assessed, as stated below, against such abutting property:

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAYETTEVILLE, NORTH CAROLINA, DOES ORDER THAT:

1) All of that portion of MAIDEN LANE which lies between RAY AVENUE and BURGESS STREET, shall be paved (or repaved) and curbs and gutters laid thereon, the cost of such improvements (exclusive of so much of said cost as is incurred at street intersections) to be specially assessed in the amount of two-thirds thereof upon the lots and parcels of land abutting upon said improved street portions according to the extent of the respective frontage thereon by an equal rate per foot of such frontage, to be paid after completion of such work and within thirty (30) days after notice of assessment, in cash with no interest, or in five equal annual installments, bearing annual interest at six (6%) percent, payable annually.

Adopted this <u>llth</u> day of <u>June</u>, <u>1962</u>, by the City Council of the City of Fayetteville, North Carolina.

Councilman Rhodes moved for acceptance of the Sanco Corporation bid of \$8,625.00 for the Wayne Model 1-770 street sweeper. Motion seconded by Councilman Plummer and unanimously carried.

The Council recognized Col. Hans C. Largen, Director and Col. Stewart Wood, Assistant Director of the office of Civil Defense. Col. Larsen presented a recently completed survey on fallout shelters and conelrad equipment. The Council then viewed a movie on fallout shelters and the effects of neuclear radiation. Following this Col. Larsen requested that funds be made available in the 1962-1963 budget for the construction of a fallout shelter and auxiliary electric generating equipment at Radio Station WFNC. Col. Larsen stated the Federal Government would assist with the cost of construction. The Council discussed the matter and at the suggestion of
