RESOLUTION AND ORDER TO FILE AND PUBLISH PRELIMINARY ASSESSMENT ROLL FOR PAVING AND OTHER IMPROVEMENT ON LAMON STREET, BETWEEN ANN STREET AND RAMSEY STREET

- North Carolina, will be held in the Court Room of the City Council of Fayetteville, North Carolina, at 8:00 P. M., on the 12th day of February, 1962, to hear allegations and objections in respect of the aforesaid special assessments, when and where all person interested may attend and be heard; and notice is further given that any place and make or file objections thereto, will be forever barred and precluded thereupon will be confirmed.
- 3) This RESOLUTION and ORDER shall be published once in the Fayetteville, Observer, a newspaper published in the City of Fayetteville, ten (10) days before the time fixed for said meeting.

AN ORDINANCE EXTENDING THE CITY LIMITS

WHEREAS, notice was duly published in the Fayetteville Observer, a newspaper published in the City of Fayetteville, that at the meeting of the City Council to be held in the City Hall at 8:00 p.m. on Feburary 12th, 1962, there would be considered the annexation to the City of all of the area hereinafter described, as directed by said Council at its regular meeting on the 12th day of February, 1962, and as petitioned for by all the owners of the property in such area;

AND WHEREAS no petition was filed or protest made against the annexation there of to the municipality;

AND WHEREAS, it is considered in the best interest of the City of Fayetteville and its inhabitants to annex said area to and include it within the municipality;

THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAYETTEVILLE DO ORDAIN:

That in accordance with North Carolina General Statute 160-452 and related statutes, said area, continguous to the present boundaries of the City, described below, be annexed to and made a part of the City of Fayetteville, to wit:

BEGINNING at a point that is located N. 79 degrees 52 minutes 40 seconds W. 20.0 feet from the tenth corner of the first tract of land conveyed by D. B. Curries, Jr., et ux, to J. P. Riddle, et ux, as recorded in Book of Deeds 884, page 102 thence N. 79 degrees 53 minutes W. 50.0 feet; thence N. 10 degrees 07 minutes E. 175.0 feet about 250 feet to the center of Branson Creek; thence N. 10 degrees 07 minutes E. direction about 250.0 feet; thence leaving the center of Branson Creek in a northwesterly 38 minutes W. about 520 feet; thence leaving the center of Branson Creek S. 17 degrees feet to the beginning.

And that the Mayor cause an accurate map of such annexed territory, together with a copy of this ordinance duly certified, to be recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds of Cumberland County and in the office of the Secretary of State.

This ordinance shall be in effect from and after its adoption.
